Please come along and join in what is going to be a wonderful club day out.



There were 12 Model T Fords entered for the weekend ranging for 1915 to 1927 models.

Friday night we met at Col and Bobbies for a BBQ dinner, which was BYO meat with a salad to share, Bobbie provided dessert and tea and coffee.

Col planned all the routes we would travel which included some excellent gravel roads. Col was the Shire Engineer in Junee before becoming a full time farmer.

Saturdays run started from the Macaulay's, we drove out to one of their farms for morning tea and inspection of the tractors, planters, headers, trucks and some vintage machinery and truck.

Our next stop was in Springdale for lunch and inspection of the park and war memorials. Following lunch, we drove to Stockinbingal stopping at the junk shop and hoping to get an ice cream, the only café/shop in town does not stock ice creams. We returned to Junee over different roads driving through farming country and bush. A great days drive of about 170km.



Saturday night the Club holds a meeting to discuss any business and plan future weekends and touring events. Bobbie and friends prepared dinner for about 30 of us on Saturday night.



Sundays run was to Bethungra. Bethungra is on the Olympic Highway and is the Gateway to the Junee Shire, we enjoyed morning tea in the park which had information boards on the Town and history of the area. We then drove up to the Bethungra Rail Spiral lookout where you can see the spiral loop in the railway line, no trains did the loop while we were there. In 1940 the Spiral was constructed as part of urgent Defence work and it is 1 of only 2 Spirals in Australia.

After the lookout we drove to the Bethungra Dam for our and lunch. The dam was built in 1894 and strengthened in 2017 to meet current standards. The dam today is a natural habitat and freedom camp site.



The return drive to Junee was via Wantabadgery and Sandy Beach where we stopped for a look at the Murrumbidgee River. Sandy Beach is also a very popular freedom camping spot. A great drive of about 130kms.



Monday run was to Coolamon for a tour of the excellent Fire Museum and the Museum of the History of the Coolman Shire. Both are excellent Museums and enjoyed by all who attended. Following lunch in Coolamon they drove to Marrar a little village between Coolamon and Junee where we visited some people who did restomods on 1930's vehicles specialising in forming anything out of metal, they also make garden furniture, arches and concrete garden pots for sale. Following the visit to Marrar the vehicles returned to Junee where most members packed up and returned home after a great weekend of Model T Ford motoring. Another great drive on about 130kms.

The unusual seating arrangement stands out, a new take on back seat drivers! The car ran very smoothly.

Another interesting car was a 1909 Schacht high wheeler, an American car designed for rural roads with wagon wheels. A very rare one was the 1903 Carlton, a British car of 9 HP and the only one in existence. It's engine rotates counter clockwise, the same odd arrangement as the Brush Marque.
