

### **AUTOMOTIVE NOTES**

#### News from the <u>Council</u> of ACT Motor Clubs Inc.

60 day usage and club runs for CRS vehicles approved by ACT Government

- The President of the Council ACT Motor Clubs, has received a letter from the Minister for Justice, Consumer Affairs and Road Safety, Shane Rattenbury, advising that he has approved amendments to the Vintage, Veteran and Historic vehicle scheme to allow for 60 day and club run usage.
- No start date for the amended scheme has been given, as there is some administrative tasks to be worked through such as design of a log book, new number plates and a Memorandum of Understanding between the Government and the Council to be approved.
- To qualify for the scheme vehicle owners will have to be a member of a vehicle club in ACT which is affiliated to the Council of ACT Motor Clubs (no change), require to have a road worthy vehicle more than 30 years old and keep a log book entry for each journey undertaken.
- The Minister also agreed to allow modified vehicles access to the 60 day arrangement, supported by 'Modified Historic' number plates. Vehicles must be 30 years old, meet full roadworthy requirements and the owner must be a member of a vehicle club affiliated with Council.
- No amendments to registration fees will be needed as part of the new arrangements, apart from the annual review of road transport fees. Premiums for the Motor Accident Insurance will be determined by the relevant Insurance Companies.
- This has been a long drawn out process but the ACT will no align with NSW on this matter. CACTMC's President has asked that clubs be patient for a little longer while the administrative processes are defined and enabled.

## THE ASSOCIATION OF VETERAN CAR CLUBS IN AUSTRALIA (TAVVCA) - ANNUAL REPORT

### Thank you to Peter Arnold, President of the Veteran Car Club of Australia (Queenland) for writing this report and making it available for us to publish in The Edwardian.

The AGM of The Association of Veteran Car Clubs in Australia (TAVCCA), our national association, was held earlier this month. Below are some of the highlights.

### **Dating Group Report:**

- The meeting agreed to the recommendations of the Dating Chairs which met during the year. These included the continuation of the dating group meeting by Zoom which will be known as the Dating Advisory Committee (DAC) and be comprised of the Dating Chairs from each member club, the FIVA Technical Officer, Andrew McDougall and the National Chairman, Paul Daly. I (Peter) will chair the committee initially but would like to hand that role over to one of the Dating members in time.
- The role of the DAC will be to implement the standardisation of the Dating Application form and the development of a universal Dating Certificate which would be available for clubs to download online. The group will also act as a forum between the member clubs on all aspects of dating and make recommendations to the National Committee where appropriate.

### 100 Year Badges:

 There was a push to allow the issue of 100 Year Badges without the need for formal dating of the vehicle. A number of clubs, including Queensland, raised concerns about having the year of manufacture of a vehicle engraved on the badge without it being verified by formal dating. This was resolved by agreeing to only have the make and model (no date) on such a vehicle's badge.

### **Constitution:**

• At the last AGM, the delegates decided that TAVCCA should become an Incorporated Association and appointed a working party to develop a constitution for consideration. The working party has been meeting by Zoom for the past 6 months to write the proposed draft constitution which was tabled at the meeting. This draft can now go to member clubs for consideration with March 2021 as the deadline for return submissions.

### **FIVA Report :**

- There were 2 points of interest from this report. The first is that FIVA Passports, which are issued by Andrew McDougal to any Australian historic vehicle which is participating in a FIVA event to prove eligibility, and will be issued electronically in future.
- The second is the result of the on-line Socio-Economic Survey which was sent to all club members to complete. This is a worldwide survey with Australia having the 6th largest response with 1,691 returns which is a statistically significant result. France had the highest with over 6,500 and countries like UK and USA had a very low return rate. Congratulations to those who went on-line to complete the survey. When the results are collated, this information will prove invaluable when lobbying governments.

## THE ASSOCIATION OF VETERAN CAR CLUBS IN AUSTRALIA (TAVVCA) - ANNUAL REPORT

#### National Events :

 Both the Charleville One and Two and the National Rally in Swan Hill are in a wait and see mode at the moment watching COVID trends and planning for various outcomes. Both committees are eager to go ahead with their events and prepared to make modifications where needed but not risk the safety of participants.

### The Brisbane to Broome Rally:

• Has been postponed to 2022 and is now being planned as a joint venture with the Heritage Motorcycle Club of WA. VCCAQ will organise the Eastern section with WA responsible for the western section. It is open to all veteran cars, commercials and motorcycles and will be held from 18th July to 11th August 2022 and entry form are available from either club.

### AHVIG

- As a result of a decision at last year's AGM, The Australian Historic Vehicle Interest Group (AHVIG) was approached as a group that we considered to be doing good work in furthering the interests of our members. Through the work of Doug Young and others they have made numerous submissions to all tires of government on the subject of removing Luxury Vehicle Tax (LVT) on vehicles over 30 years old and the issue of asbestos in imported vehicle. Daryl Meek was asked to represent us on AHVIG and gave a comprehensive report back.
- We initially said we would review our relationship after 2 years but have agreed to extend that by 12 months due to the inactivity during the COVID crisis. Like us, AHVIG has decide to seek incorporation as it plans to expand its advocacy role and its relationship with government. There has been some success on the LVT issue with the submission being listed in Senate papers earlier this year, but the Government priorities changed with COVID 19. Hopefully it will be relisted when discussions restart. There has also been relaxation where a vehicle is exported for restoration and then re-imported without changing ownership. AHVIG is also looking at adopting the FIVA standards as listed in the Charter of Turin, particularly in relation to category descriptors.

#### **Office Bearers**

• Because the National Rally cycle was pushed out one year due to COVID and the rotation for office-bearers is tied to the National Rally cycle, it is Victoria's turn to again nominate the Chairman and W.A. the vice Chairman. Both Paul Daley and John Burke have been appointed to hold those respective roles. Hamish McDonald has had his role of Secretary Treasurer extended for another year. Congratulations to all and we look forward to working with you for another year.

#### CRACKING EGGS WITH MOTOR CARS. SOME REMARKABLE FEATS.

In order to demonstrate his complete control of a motor-vehicle, and incidentally to show his driving prowess, an enterprising motorist devised a curious feat. It is not everyone that would trust his watch to the tender mercies of a car weighing some fifteen hundredweight for the purpose of closing its case. Yet this driver can carry out the operation with as much ease as the skilful conjurer can bake a cake in your best silk hat. For this curious performance the motorist utilises a small teeter, which is placed on the ground with the watch, one of the ordinary type, with the back case opened. The car is then driven backward on to the teeter, pressing the opened case back into position, which closes with a click as the car comes to a stop, without cracking the watch glass or otherwise damaging the timepiece.

A rival motorist, determined not to be outshone by this performance, utilises a hen's egg in place of the watch. A similar teeter is used, upon which the egg is laid. In this case the motorist drives the car backwards or forwards as desired, and just strikes the egg with the wheel with sufficient force to fracture the shell. The crack can be distinctly heard. The contents of the egg, however, are in no way disturbed, and when opened the yalk is found to be as intact as if the shell had been broken by the housewife in the orthodox method.

Quite a stir was caused at a circus recently by a tight-rope walker carrying out his gyrations upon a wire carried on a motor-car while the vehicle was travelling round the arena at full speed. At each end of the vehicle a pole was raised about 10ft in height, and from the top stretched a wire. Upon this walked the tight-rope exponent, while his companion drove the vehicle below. Considering the inequalities of the ground and the rapidity with which the motorist turned sharp corners, the ability of the man on the rope to retain his balance was remarkable. Another ambitious and skilful manipulator is at the present time rehearsing a tight-rope performance in which the machine itself is to participate. For this purpose two ropes about 1% and a some thickness and some 150ft in length are slung between supports at a height from the ground. The distance between the two ropes is equivalent to the track of the wheels.

The car itself has no tyres, but the concave parts of the rims is made to run on the ropes. While the vehicle is itself being driven along this aerial ropeway another performer indulges in gymnastic feats upon an apparatus fixed to the car. This performance calls for considerable nerve and skill on the part of both the performers, since the driver has to study carefully the sagging tendencies of the rope, which when the car reaches the central point are considerable, while at the same time there is a decided sideswinging which necessitates constant consideration. Furthermore, the motorist has to counteract the movements of the acrobat so that the equilibrium of the vehicle may not be disturbed.

#### Did you know?

#### What are these?



These are Traffic light prisms. They were used from the 1920's into the 1950's to view traffic lights that were often mounted on wires high in the centre of the intersections and were obscured by the roof or visor of the car.



What are all of the pedals on this 1950 Buick?

Starting from the left, the parking brake, dimmer switch, clutch pedal, brake pedal, gas pedal, and then the starter pedal. The starter pedal however was more than a foot actuated electrical switch. It also connected to a mechanical linkage that moved the starter pinion into mechanical engagement with the engines flywheel ring gear.

Why do these spark plugs have green insulators?



Released by the Splitdorf Company, these insulators were made out of ruby mica rather than porcelain. The mica was more durable than porcelain being less susceptible to cracks or breaking.



Did you know that some engine oil filters used toilet paper as filter elements?



These were popular when the Model T was new, but were still being sold into the 50's.
